"SMOKE-FREE CITY" The Concept

- "Comprehensive smoke-free legislation" prohibits smoking in all indoor workplaces, all indoor public places, and on all public transportation as recommended by the WHO FCTC Article 8 implementation guidelines (on protection from exposure to tobacco smoke).
- "Smoke-free city" has adopted and implemented legislation that prohibits smoking in all indoor (or enclosed) workplaces, all indoor public places, and all public transportation, with no exceptions.



"SMOKE-FREE CITY" A Project of MoNHSRC

- □ "Smoke Free Islamabad Model" established within 3 years (2014 2017) through 85 % compliance of all sections of tobacco control laws and WHO's mpower policy.
- "Tobacco Vend Act 1958" adopted / enforced by Chief Commissioner Islamabad through vend fee revision (1000 3000 PKR) and dedicated Excise & Taxation Team (2015 2017). 1232 tobacco vendors registered through pledging compliance of all tobacco control laws.






